Pass The Paint (ART)

Category Overview

What happens when an artwork keeps changing hands?

Pass the Paint is a team based category built around collaboration, adaptability, and artistic interpretation. Each team will begin with an original artwork, but no one artist will be able to see their idea through from beginning to end.

Teams will work on their artwork for two hours before passing it to another member of their team. The new artist must respond to what is already on the canvas, adding their own ideas while working with the decisions made before them. With every swap, the artwork evolves into something none of the artists could have created alone.

The final piece is the result of every hand that touched it.

Round 1:

Days 1, 2 & 3

Team Size: Minimum 2 individuals, Maximum 4 individuals (sets of 2 only)

Duration: As allocated by the category heads

Swap Interval: Every 2 hours

Each team will be given two artwork to work on. At the end of every two hour period, the artwork will be passed to another member of the same team.

The process will continue until the allocated time has ended.

Judging Criteria

- (15) Collaboration - How effectively does the team build upon each member's contribution?
- (20) Composition - How cohesive, balanced, and visually engaging is the final artwork?
- (15) Adaptability - How effectively does each artist respond to and develop the work they receive?
- (15) Creativity - How original and inventive are the team's artistic decisions?
- (10) Technical Execution - How effectively are the chosen mediums and techniques used?

Pass The Paint (ART)

Rules

- Teams must consist of a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 4 individuals. (in sets)
- Each team must work on a single final artwork.
- Teams will swap the artwork between members every 2 hours, as instructed by the category heads.
- Only one member of a team may work on the artwork at a time.
- Members may build upon, modify, or develop existing elements, but may not completely discard the work of previous members.
- Teams may communicate with one another, but members may not work on the artwork while it is with another member.
- All team members must contribute to the final artwork.
- Delegates are expected to bring their own materials.
- References may be used, provided that they are submitted to the category heads where required.
- Artworks must be submitted to the category heads whenever a delegate is not actively working on them.
- All work must be completed within the time allocated by the category heads.
- All artwork must be the original work of the participating team.
- Depicting profane, sexual, violent, or explicit content may result in disqualification and or disciplinary action at the sole discretion of the equity board.
