Naach & Nuance (MISCELLANEOUS)

Category Overview

This dance competition at Muse will serve as an open platform for all styles of movement. The category is completely open, welcoming classical, contemporary, hip hop, cultural, and experimental dancers to share the same stage. To prioritize artistic expression and give every participant a fair chance to present their full capabilities, the event will feature two non-eliminative rounds. Every registered dancer or crew will perform twice, and the final standings will be determined by their cumulative scores across both performances.

Round 1: Foundation

Time Limit: 3 to 5 minutes

Format: This initial performance allows dancers to introduce their primary style to the audience and judges. Participants are encouraged to showcase their core strengths, focusing on technique, rhythm, and baseline stage presence.

Progression: All performers automatically advance to the second round regardless of their score in this phase.

Round 2: Expansion

Time Limit: 4 to 6 minutes

Format: With a longer time allowance, dancers have the room to explore complex choreography, deeper storytelling, or even switch to a different dance style. This round tests endurance, creative versatility, and the ability to hold the audience's attention for an extended period.

Judging Criteria

Since no participants are cut after the first round, judges will evaluate each performance independently out of 100 points. The scores from Round 1 and Round 2 will be combined to calculate the final rankings.

Evaluation Areas:

1. Technical Execution: Precision, body control, and clear understanding of the chosen dance style.
2. Choreography: Creativity in routine building, effective use of stage space, and smooth transitions.
3. Musicality: How well the movements interpret the beat, rhythm, and mood of the selected track.
4. Performance Quality: Energy, facial expressions, and overall ability to engage the audience.

Music Submission: Audio tracks must be submitted in MP3 format at least one day before the event. Explicit language in the music is not allowed.

Props and Wardrobe: Dancers may use props as long as they are safe and can be cleared from the stage within thirty seconds. Costumes must align with the general school dress code while remaining functional for heavy physical activity.

Stage Rules: Items that leave a residue, such as liquids, glitter, or confetti, are not permitted on stage to prevent slip hazards and delays between performances.
